### **ROTARY DISTRICT AWARDS 2015-16**

### **Grouping of Clubs for Awards**

### (Membership as mentioned on 1st July 2015 invoice)

Group A - Clubs with membership 51 and more

Group B - Clubs with membership 31 to 50

Group C - Clubs with membership up to 30

Group D - New Clubs chartered during the year

#### **Basic Eligibility Criteria**

- 1. Must have paid first semi annual dues before 30th September 2015 and second semi annual dues before 31st March 2016.
- 2. Must have paid District Fund before 30th September 2015.
- 3. Must have paid full year subscription to Rotary News for all Rotarians on the roll other than spouses of Rotarians as members before 30th September 2015. Further, club must have no previous dues to Rotary News or Rotarian Magazine.
- 4. A certificate from the Assistant Governor declaring that the clubs have discharged the following obligations should reach the District Secretary (Awards) before 15th May 2016.
  - a) Payments of RI invoice, District Fund, and subscription to magazine must have been made before the dates specified above.
  - b) Audited Accounts for the year 2014-15 must be ready.
  - c) Budget for the year 2015-16 must have been presented.
  - d) All monthly reports have been submitted on time.
  - e) Clubs must have maintained the records of Meeting Minutes, Board meeting minutes, Attendance register, Roster of filled and unfilled classification, TRF contribution register and other mandatory documents.

### **Guidelines for Reporting**

- Each club shall send a monthly report of activities through the "Online Report Submission Form" available in the District Website www.rotary3212.in. The report should be completed online on or before 20th of the following month. If it is not done so, this clubs should obtain permission from their AG to open the link.
- If the report is not received before the last day of the following month, that particular report will not be considered for the awards.
- Only projects undertaken and completed by the clubs between July 01 and April 30th, 2016 will be considered for the awards. Clubs had their installation in June 2015 can include the projects done during installations and there after, if any, in the July report.
- 4. Projects should be reported only after completion, giving complete details of duration of project, financial outlay, Rotarians' involvement and beneficiaries of the project.
- Wherever financial obligation details are reported, like RI Invoice, District Fund, Rotary New Subscription, Literacy Contribution etc. Copies of the concerned receipts must be sent.
- 6. AGs should give their approval along with their comments before 25th of every month.
- AG should send a separate report to certify that the following club administration reports are available with the club and being maintained regularly. Marks will be awarded to the clubs with meticulous records.
  - a) Charter certificate duly displayed at club meetings.
  - b) President's manual.
  - c) Secretary's manual.
  - d) Roster of filled and unfilled classification.
  - e ) Attendance Register.
  - f) Rotary Foundation contribution records.
  - g) Matching /Global Grant/ Project Records, if any.

- h) Board meeting minutes book.
- i) Weekly meeting minutes book.
- j) Club Assembly minutes book
- k. General Body meeting minutes book.
- 8. In every quarterly review meeting, District Secretary (Award) will evaluate the performance of the club till date.
- 9. In their quarterly report, AGs shall certify whether the club is conducting regular weekly meetings, monthly board meetings and club assemblies as specified.
- 10. Report of membership development and retention should reflect in the Club database in My Rotary.
